Autumn: Unit 1 - Introductions

- I can say hello and goodbye in French
- I can say my name in French
- I can add French numbers together
- I can tell you how old I am in French
- I can tell you about my family in French
- I can take part in a simple role play conversation in French

Spring: Unit 3 - Birthdays

- I can tell you when my birthday is in French
- I can tell you how to ask someone their birthday in French
- I can unscramble letters to write French numbers
- I can say and/write the days of the week in French
- I can tell you some numbers in French

Summer: Unit 5 – Parts Of The Body

- I can label parts of the body in French
- I can read the French words and tell you the name of the body part in English
- I can you tell you a sentence to describe me in French

Autumn: Unit 7 – Transport

- I can say different modes of transport in French
- I can give opinions on modes of transport in French
- I can write short sentences about transport in French
- I can translate transport words from French to English and from English to French
- I can appreciate 'parce que' and 'mais' and use them in spoken or written sentences as conjunctions

Spring: Unit 10 – Healthy Eating

- I can name a range of fruits and vegetables in French
- I can ask friends for their opinions on foods and record their answers
- I can translate French to English when listening to foods being read out loud
- I can understand main points from a passage that is being spoken about food, in French

Summer: Unit 11 – Sports and Hobbies

- I can say 'I play/do' multiple sports in French
- I can read and understand simple sentences about sports in French
- I can appreciate and understand how French pronouns change in relation to gender and plurality
- I can write down English translations for simple sentences about sports, written in French

Autumn: Unit 13 – Quel temps fait-il?

- I can tell you what 'il pleut' means
- I can say 'when it..., I go to the ...' in French
- I can pronounce words clearly
- I can ask and answer questions about the weather
- I can write and present a simple weather forecast in French

Spring: Unit 15 – Time

- I can ask questions about the time
- I can answer questions about the time
- I can use numbers up to 60
- I can translate sentences about time

Summer: Unit 16 – En Ville

- I can recognise the names of important places in town
- I can give directions to a place on a simple map
- I can describe my town
- I can read and translate sentences about 'en ville'



Year 6 French Passport



Autumn: Unit 19 – At School

- I can name a range of school subjects in French
- I can use French vocabulary to give reasons why I like or dislike subjects at school
- I can name a range of classroom equipment and furniture in French
- I can use some French positional language to describe a classroom

Speaking specific task:

- I can say at least 2 simple sentences in French
- I can begin to use some prepositions, adjectives and connectives in spoken French

Spring: Unit 20 – Where I live

- I can use a range of vocabulary relating to places people live e.g. house, town, village, countryside
- I can name a range of rooms in a house in French
- I can describe what I like to do at home in the evening

Writing Specific Task:

- I can write simple sentences in French about where I live using familiar words
- I can begin to include opinions and connectives in French Writing

Summer: Unit 22 – Holidays

- I can name a range of countries in French
- I can describe a range of different types of weather in French
- I can name a range of holiday activities in French e.g. swimming, shopping and describe what I like and don't like to do on holiday
- I can recall singular and plural pronouns in French
- I can begin to recall and use the vocabulary of the irregular verb 'to Go' (aller)
- I can begin to explore using Present and Passe tenses in French

Writing Specific Task

- I can write a postcard in French about an imagined holiday
